SUBJECT: Approvals/Waivers for Obligation of Funds for Data Servers and Centers

References: (a) DoD Chief Information Officer Memorandum, January 19, 2012

In accordance with reference (a), the Secretaries of the Military Departments and the heads of the Defense Agencies were asked to submit Performance Plans to the DoD Chief Information Officer for the obligation of funds for data servers and centers. Components who have not submitted their Performance Plans shall not obligate funds for data server farms, data centers, or information technology designated for those areas.

Any Component seeking to obligate funds for data servers or data centers must obtain prior approval from the DoD CIO by submitting a request for approval to obligate funds for data servers and centers. The request must be signed by the Component CIO and include a completed request for the Authorization of Funds for Data Centers and Data Server Farms in accordance with NDAA FY12 Section 2867, information sheet (attached). Components shall not obligate funds until the requests have been approved.

Unclassified requests can be sent via email to NDAAFY12Approvals@osd.mil. Classified requests can be sent to james.brown@osd.smil.mil. Requests will be processed within 15 calendar days. Components are encouraged to bundle numerous requests using the attached template. Expedited requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
