Orientation Training Why Using NC-2 Saves Time & \$



- IDIQ level contracts have proven ability to buy best-value products and services that deliver mission-critical results faster
 - > FAR Part 16.5 takes 4-5 months (depending on customers' local approval process)
 - > FAR Part 15 takes 8-18 months (including source selection, RFI/RFQ, Acquisition Strategy Plan approvals, Requirements Approval Document (RAD) review/approval & leadership briefs/approvals/reviews, etc.)
 - FAR Part 16.5 versus FAR Part 15 Compared on chart 10
- Process is streamlined to speed up service delivery times
 - > Expedited ordering process in place to reduce acquisition lead times
 - Established negotiated contract terms and rates are already done
 - Mandatory acquisition and contractual requirements are initially vetted
 - > Task Orders are competed to bring cost down and awarded faster than normal processes

Contracting by Negotiation (FAR Part 15)

Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) (FAR Part 16.5)

Description

FAR Part 15 describes the procedures for competitive and non-competitive open market acquisitions exceeding the Simplified Acquisition Threshold (SAT). Open market is defined as products or services not available from required sources of supply, such as GSA schedule contracts, outlined in FAR 8.

IDIQ contracts provide a method to order from existing indefinite-delivery contracts awarded by another agency (i.e. Government-wide Acquisition Contracts (GWAC) and Multi-Agency Contracts (MAC)). Existing IDIQ contracts should be considered prior to establishing a new agency specific single or multiple award IDIQ vehicle. However, establishing an agency unique IDIQ contract may be an appropriate business decision to support a portfolio of programs when recurring needs are anticipated.

Acquisition/Contract Efforts Market Research



Market Research is required for all acquisitions (FAR Part 10) and must be documented

- Essential to the government's ability to buy best-value products and services that deliver mission-critical results
- Templates are available (NETCENTS Website)

Market Research for a NETCENTS task order (at a minimum)

- Description of Govt's needs sufficient to allow market research
- Type of procurement commercial, non-developmental, non-commercial items (includes services); consider risk
- Current market conditions and technology influencing requirements
- Customary practices and associated costs (warranty, financing, discounts, etc.)
- Requirements of laws/regulations unique to the acquisition
- Size and status of potential sources (FAR Part 19)



Acquisition/Contract Efforts S/W Certification Requirements



Minimum levels of certification or appraisal held by the prime contractor & maintained over the life of the contract

Application Services

■ Full & Open – CMMI Level III

NetOps and Infrastructure Solutions

Customers cannot ask for higher certification levels on task orders; customers can evaluate specific higher level processes as discriminators



Acquisition/Contract Efforts NC-2 Subcontracting



Subcontracting Plan Approval at the ID/IQ Level

- Full and Open Required IAW FAR 19.7 for large businesses
- Small Business Companion IAW FAR 19.7 plan not required

Do not add a subcontracting plan at the Task Order (TO) level

Limitations in subcontracting clause

Monitoring and Evaluation accomplished at IDIQ level

Subcontractors are NOT approved at the IDIQ Level, they are approved at the task order level



Acquisition/Contract Efforts App Svs & NetOps SB vs F&O



At the Task Order (TO) level, Small Business Specialists will review all acquisitions over \$10,000 (DDF 2579)

The Small Business (SB) contracts have the same scope of coverage as the Full and Open (F&O) contracts

When determining to compete a TO in the F&O or SB contract pool:

- Anticipated dollar value over micro-purchase threshold up to the Simplified Acquisition Threshold (SAT)
 - Set-aside for Small Business
 - If a task order is competed in the Small Business Companion contract pool and no offers, or no acceptable offers are received, the RFP shall be withdrawn and re-solicited in the F&O pool

Exceeding SAT

- The task order CO conducts market research to determine if there is a reasonable expectation of receiving at least two offers from SB Companion contractors. If market research reveals at least two small businesses capable of performing the work, the task order should be competed in the SB Companion contract pool
- If a task order is competed in the SB Companion contract pool and no offers, or acceptable offers are received, the RFP shall be withdrawn and re-solicited in F&O pool



Acquisition/Contract Efforts TOs Request for Proposals



North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code

- If your requirement is in scope of the basic contract, the NAICS code for each task order issued under a long-term ID/IQ contract must correspond to the NAICS code assigned to the umbrella ID/IQ contract. 13 CFR 12.403(g)
- You must use, even if a more specific one may apply for your requirement

Requirements Approval Document (RAD)

- NETCENTS-2 has an approved blanket RAD; Individual RADs may not be required for orders (check for local and MAJCOM policy)

Acquisition/Contract Efforts Task Orders RFPs (con't)



Task Order Request for Proposals (RFPs) must include contract clauses specific to the order, examples include

. . .

- Option Clauses If options are being utilized, the option clauses
 MUST be cited in the TO RFP and included in the TO
- Tax Clauses If OCONUS performance is required, the tax clauses appropriate to the country/region of performance must be cited in the TO RFP and included in the TO
- Government Property
- Payment (Wide Area Workflow) Information/Instructions

H137 Task Order RFP Procedures

- Sets expectations for our vendors
- Addresses the proposal process (including technical and cost/price)



Acquisition/Contract Efforts Task Orders RFPs (con't)



Cover Letter

Basic RFP/RFQ information – ID #, due date/time, POC info, solicitation provisions, etc.

Instructions to Offerors

- Indicate format, page limits, etc.
- Ask only for things you are evaluating
 - Ensure consistent with evaluation criteria
 - Level of detail required for evaluation

Evaluation Criteria/Procedures (FAR Part 16.505 – Ordering)

- Price
- Technical
- Past performance



Acquisition/Contract Efforts Task Orders RFPs (con't)



Contractor Performance Assessment Report

- CPAR required for Task Orders >\$1M annually
- Provide a CPAR POC (normally the Task Order COR)

Contractor Manpower Reporting

- Each Task Order should provide the contractor with your Requiring Activity <u>Unit Identification Code (UIC)</u>
- Contractors required to report all labor hours (including subcontractor labor hours) required for performance of services in Contractor Manpower Reporting Application at http://www.ecmra.mil
- Note: Reporting will move to SAM.Gov in near future



Acquisition/Contract Efforts CLIN Structure



Orders must be issued IAW the awarded IDIQ

Ordering offices must use the CLIN appropriate to both the contract type and ordering period

CLINs cannot be used if they have not been awarded in the basic IDIQ; CLINS include/indicate the ordering period

CLINs are used to track contract ceiling

CLINs are used to track usage of contract type

Accuracy of FPDS-NG reporting is dependent upon appropriate use of CLIN structure

More than one CLIN type can be used, if required – FP, CR, LH

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
